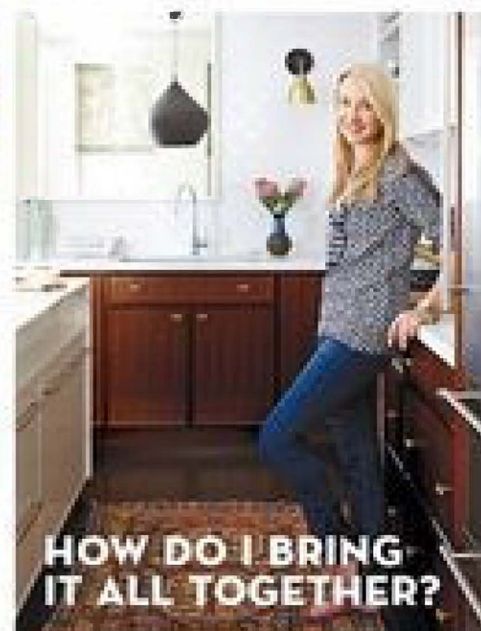

A For a simple, polished look, you can't go wrong with toilets that have a concealed trapway. They're a snap to clean, come in a variety of styles and are available at all price points. If your toilet is visible when the bathroom door is open, they're a go-to choice.
